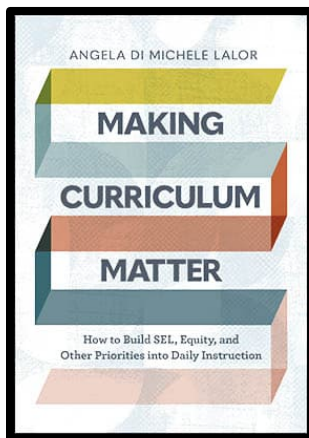


# Attending to Equity Through Curriculum and Instruction

**Program Description:** This webinar will provide participants with specific strategies for addressing important principles of equity through curriculum and daily instructional practices.

**Program Outcome:** Participants will examine how to use curriculum and instruction to attend to important principles of equity by

- examining ways to communicate and hold all students to high-expectations
- honoring students cultural and experiential backgrounds through diverse and inclusive texts, resources, and learning activities
- providing students with a voice in what they learn, how they learn it, and how they share their learning with others
- involving students in their communities to recognize issues facing their communities, what can be done about them and preparing them for future civic engagement
- building student's human and social capital
- recognizing the multiple aspects of student identities
- providing strategies students can use to become independent, self-regulated learners

**Session One:** Participants will examine how to use curriculum to design engaging learning experiences that hold all students to high-expectations. They will determine how giving students voice and choice through curriculum-embedded performance assessments provides them with a way to make connections to their lives and experiences, and see themselves in what they are learning in the classroom.

**Session Two:** Participants will examine different ways to support students in developing positive identities as learners. They will identify strategies that students can use to set goals, monitor and adjust their learning to achieve them, and become independent, self-regulated learners.
